Konkan Flood, Rescue and Relief Work

A massive flood hit Konkan region and surrounding areas. Many cities and towns are experiencing one of the worst floods in decades, pushing thousands of people living in low lying areas and slums into misery. There is an urgent need for food and other essentials. The amount of damage caused has been unusual. Many roads and buildings are damaged and lives in the affected areas have come to a standstill. Society for Bright Future is actively involved in the relief and rehabilitation in the flood affected region, and a large number of volunteers reached immediately and started rescue at Chiplun and Mahad, Maharashtra.



Following are the major tasks done by the Volunteers:

 25000 food packets distributed.
Hundreds of houses, shops and religious places cleaned up by the volunteers.
Surveys carried out to assess the damage.

WATER PURIFICATION TRAINING PROGRAMME

DRMV Bandia organized a Water Purification Training Programme and Water Cans Distribution Programme at East Mangaldai Superstar Club, Bandia on 14 Sept 2021.

Mr. Herokjyoti Sharma of the Public Health Engineering Department (PHE) Mangaldai division imparted water purification training. He stressed on the importance of water purification and safe drinking water during floods.

Mr. Matiur Rehman, Bhapen Kalita district coordinator, and block coordinator Sohidul Islam also addressed the gathering and gave instructions related with sanitation and hygiene.

Besides, a Water Cans Distribution Programme was also conducted in which 60 water cans were distributed to the people residing in the lowlands of Bandia. The area has been inundated due to rise in water level in River Brahmaputra during floods.

Volunteers of SBF and Asha workers actively participated in successfully conducting the event.



FLOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Due to the sudden rise in water level at River Brahmaputra, the lower reaches of Bandia and its surrounded areas have submerged.



Around 60 families of Bandia lowland areas have taken shelter at Bandia high Land. These families consist of 335 persons including 8 infants. Our SBF Volunteers provide them water and food packets and Build temporary camps and toilet. SBF also provide boat services for flood affected people staying in temporary camps in the highlands of Bandia. This service will help the poor people of Bandia during emergency evacuations of patients as well as addressing the transportation needs.

SANITATION AND HEALTH CARE PROGRAM

DRMV Bandia organized a sanitation and health care awareness programme on the banks of Tangni River near Bandia Highland which was attended by sixty flood-affected families. Local ASHA workers Malensha Khatun, Nurjahan Begum, and School Worker Maryam Begum spoke on the occasion. Phenoyl was distributed among the families with the help of SBF volunteers.
